# SUNDAY 2ND MAY

2-16 May is the HEAL OUR LAND fortnight, in the Mersey Region: a week of prayer followed by a week of evangelism that begins here and then tours cities through the UK. The aim is for churches to come together in unity, recognising the need of our nation for a move of God, and to call out to Him in prayer together to bring healing. A key verse is:

*"If my people, who are called by my name, will humble themselves and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then will I hear from heaven and will forgive their sin and will heal their land"*

**2 Chronicles 7:14**

The central focus of the 2 weeks is the Prayer Concert on Monday 10th May at the Liverpool Anglican Cathedral. Another hugely significant date in our week of prayer is the general election and local elections on May 6th. These issues and others affecting the well-being of our society are covered in this prayer guide.

Please use today to prepare for the week of prayer. Remember, you are part of an army of people from many different churches across the Mersey Region, who will be praying. As you come before the Lord in preparation for the coming period of prayer, meditate on this Christian song from St Paul's letter to the Colossians. Pray it out to the Lord. Acknowledge His greatness and thank Him for what He has done for us.

## **Colossians 1:15-20**

*(Jesus) is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn over all creation.*

*For by him all things were created: things in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or powers or rulers or authorities; all things were created by him and for him.*

*He is before all things, and in him all things hold together.*

*And he is the head of the body, the church; he is the beginning and the firstborn from among the dead, so that in everything he might have the supremacy.*

*For God was pleased to have all his fullness dwell in him, and through him to reconcile to himself all things, whether things on earth or things in heaven, by making peace through his blood, shed on the cross..*

## OUR NEIGHBOURS

When Jesus was asked what is the most important commandment in the law, he said, "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind", and went on to say, "Love your neighbour as yourself."

What a way to show love for them by praying for them. At a time of great insecurity, our neighbours need our prayer more than ever.

You can pray for their practical and emotional needs, and you can pray for their spiritual needs.

As you pray for your neighbours meditate on this: prayer is first and foremost a relationship with God; it is a position of dependence on God and it is being in the place of His loving embrace.

**One way of praying for your neighbours is to use the acronym BLESS.**

**B** - pray for their bodily needs

**L** - pray that they will know God's love

**E** - pray for their economic needs

**S** - pray for their spiritual needs

**S** - pray for their social needs

Pray for an openness to the Gospel, for the "Lord to open their hearts to respond" (Acts 16:4)

Pray for salvation

Pray for opportunities to meet your neighbours and to be their friends

Pray for God's gifts to help you discern their felt needs and their unspoken needs.

Pray for the things they ask you to pray for.

## THE FAMILY

**Protecting human life, protecting marriage, and protecting freedom of conscience are foundational for creating and maintaining strong families. Because of our Christian faith we can pray believing it will make a difference to the family in our community**

### MARRIAGE FACTS

85% of UK couples are married.

74% of people think that being married is the most desirable way to live

9 out of 10 teenagers under 16 say they want to marry.

There were over 300,000 marriages in the UK last year

### ABORTION FACTS

There are 600 abortions a day in the UK, equal to 200,000 per year.

98% of all abortions are for social reasons.

The parliamentary inquiry in 2006/7, according to one report, was shaped by ideological and financial interests.

Only 27% of people questioned in a poll believed that the current 24 week legal limit for abortion should be retained while 58% of those questioned by *YouGov* said abortions should not be carried out after the 20th week of pregnancy

**PRAY** for organisations that support and strengthen family life, such as "Care for the Family", "Care Trust" and "The National Couple Support Network"

**PRAY** for government legislation that will be positive towards marriage and the family.

**PRAY** for an increase in the awareness of the value of marriage that promotes marriage as the best environment for children to be brought up in.

**PRAY** for those in families in St Helens who are:

Going through difficult times;

Coping with illness or disability in their family;

Feeling the pain of family breakdown;

Not sure they are loved and valued for who they are;

Tired and exhausted;

Experiencing the effects of unemployment

**PRAY** about the issues families have to face including bullying; the Internet, particularly social networking sites; inappropriate TV programmes; that the Lord would help us to act wisely and righteously in our families.

**PRAY** about the on-going issue of abortion (see left) that is a blight on our nation. Pray for a parliament that will not act in a biased way when it reconsiders the legislation. Pray for godly men and women in positions of influence who will work to bring about godly change in the legislation.

# TUESDAY 4TH MAY

## THE ECONOMY & BUSINESS

Everybody knows that a major issue for the nation and the region is the economy. As Christians our perspective is that we face not only an economic crisis, but a spiritual and moral crisis. It is an age of compliance not conscience. When a government loses its moral compass everything flounders.

PLEASE PRAY for a new appreciation of the need for a moral, righteous basis for doing business, as opposed to the greed culture that has dominated many parts of business in recent years.

PLEASE PRAY for good leadership in the business sector, in our region and nationally.

PRAY for the North West Development Agency in Warrington, that they continue to operate under the new government.

*PRAY for Christian organisations working for the Kingdom of God in the business world. Especially remember the North West Christian Business Forum (led by Christopher Gibaud & John Manwell) and the International Christian Chamber of Commerce (Pam Coates plays a leading role locally). Pray for all involved, that they will have a real understanding of these times and that they will receive all the resources that they need to carry out their roles.*

**PRAY** for the increased prosperity and growth of employment in the town, that the affects of the recession will be overcome by diligence and integrity.

**PRAY** for established businesses in St Helens that they prosper and provide secure employment for the people of the town

**PRAY** for Christian Business leaders & owners in St Helens to get a new understanding of God's purpose for business and economic growth. That they have hearts set to support our local communities, particularly regarding the alleviation of poverty and the enabling of men and women to start new businesses.

**PRAY** for young Christian men and women to rise up as a new generation of entrepreneurs, supported by established Christian business men and women who will sponsor and mentor them.

Heavenly Father, we pray for all those Christians involved in the business world. May they carry your presence and speak your peace into the workplace. Anoint their gifts of creativity and their energy that they may bring you honour in the tasks they face. When they are confused, guide them. When they are weary, energize them. When they are burned out, infuse them with the light of Your Holy Spirit. May their efforts bring hope, light and courage to all that they come into contact with. Amen

# SATURDAY 8TH MAY

**The two weeks from 2nd to 16th May are the Heal Our Land fortnight in the Mersey Region.**

The first week is a week of prayer, where churches, groups and individuals will be praying for God to heal our nation and region.

On Monday 10th May at 7.30 pm at the Liverpool Anglican Cathedral the prayer will culminate in a great Prayer Concert celebrating the great diversity in the church in the region and calling out to God for a move of His power here.

The prayer concert also launches a week of local evangelism across the region.

**PRAISE GOD** for all the people involved in praying during this week of prayer. Give thanks that God has heard our prayers as we have lifted our hands and hearts to him.

**PRAY** for one outcome to be an increase in the prayers of grass-roots Christians as they comprehend the power of prayer to bring spiritual change to our city.

**PRAY** for the week of evangelism 10th to 16th May, for events taking place across Liverpool - that many people will hear a credible presentation of the Good News about Jesus Christ.

**PRAY** for the special multi-church outreach planned for Newsham Park, Liverpool on 15th May.

### PRAYER CONCERT

Please remember the event at the Cathedral on Monday 10th.

Pray for the rehearsal at Liverpool Lighthouse tonight.

Pray for all the narrators, singers, dancers choirs, musicians, leaders and pray-ers involved in the concert, that God will receive all the glory.

Pray for a full congregation

Pray for the finances, that all the costs will be covered.

Pray for a great encouragement for the people who come to the concert, that they may grow in faith and in confidence in the Gospel.

**PRAY** for their personal time - for relaxation and renewal, to avoid the pressures and stress of ministry.

**PRAY** for them if appropriate as husband/wife, and as father/mother.

**PRAY** for them as they lead worship, and in their roles as church leader - particularly their relationships with church members, and any relationships that are difficult at this time.

**PRAISE GOD** for all the good things about the Church in St Helens, particularly the level of mutual recognition and support between churches and Christians through SHINE. Praise God for the commitment to Christ being at the centre of St Helens, and for the desire to see Christ at the heart of the plans for the town. **PRAY** for the right person to be the faith community representative on the Economic Development and Enterprise Group in the town

**GIVE THANKS** for all the positive contributions that the Church has made to the life of the town.

**PRAY** for an increase in the depth of the unity between churches, that Christians hear Paul's injunction to *“make every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit”*.

## THE COMMUNITY

St Helens Council is divided into 16 wards, each ward being represented by 3 councillors. There is an election of one councillor to each of the wards each year, which takes place on 6th May this year.

Elections are held in thirds, with one seat for each ward becoming vacant annually. Each councillor is elected for a term of 4 years

Pray that all politicians who will be elected will be open and sympathetic to what Christians say and the work they do in the town.

Pray that the town will flourish under the the government of the new council.

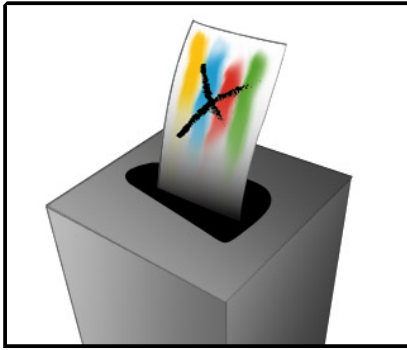

On this day when we choose who will govern us for the next five years, please pray for Christians to make use of their votes; to be motivated by concern for our nation and not by apathy. When Archbishop Desmond Tutu was first allowed to vote he was over 60 years old! Pray for people in our region to be stirred to exercise the democratic privilege they have enjoyed throughout their adult lives.
